

EARTHQUAKE RECONSTRUCTION VOLUNTEER PLACEMENT SPEC



Below is a summary of what you can expect from volunteering on our Earthquake Reconstruction Project. As a small charity, we heavily rely on our volunteers to participate in our projects and to spread the word about our work.

As an Earthquake Reconstruction intern, you will be mainly responsible for:

- Regularly visiting project sites and drafting a progress report after every trip for the UK team.
- Monitoring and assisting with construction, especially checking the quality of the materials.
- Taking photos and videos for promotional purposes. Then uploading these pictures onto the Shared Google Drive.
- Keeping a log of your accounts during the visit, and passing these to Bandana, our office administrator on your return.
- Liaising with our Technical Advisor, Mr John Kearsley, over any issues that may have arisen during a site visit.

Before arriving in Nepal, we would suggest that you familiarise yourself with all the documents relating to the Earthquake Reconstruction Project in the Shared Google Drive. In the file, entitled EARTHQUAKE RECONSTRUCTION, you will find documents relating both to Lamagaun and Sourpani/Kulgaun, the two villages where we have projects on going.

On site visits, you will always be accompanied by an interpreter for the duration of the visit, and will stay in a reconstructed house designated for MT volunteers. At times, you will need to take public transport to the village and please be aware that the road conditions are not always good.

Of course, you are welcome to participate in any of the other projects that we currently have on-going. This list is not exhaustive but gives you an idea of some of the things that you will be expected to do during your placement.

This role is really important in the smooth running of our organisation, and we look forward to hearing from you.
